

Each month we hope to have a club member profile in the newsletter, so with that in mind I sent out some questions to various club members.

- 1. When, how & why did you first get involved with birds?
- 2. What sort of birds do you keep?
- 3. What sort of set up do you have?
- 4. What do you like about birds as a hobby?
- 5. What advice would you pass on to new members?
- 6. How did you hear about the AMBC/and any comments/suggestionsfor the club?

### Club member profile Werner Krieger

- 1. Way back in Germany 1950. I was 12 years old and got a siskin (European) for my birthday. I loved this bird, it got very tame and I could later breed hybrids with a canary. These birds were perfect singers and I could sell them and could then buy a canary cock bird and this was the start to my canary career. You should also know, that money was in short supply and my pocket money per month (!) was only 40 cents. A siskin would cost DM 2, a goldfinch DM 3 and a canary cock bird about DM 10. The DM can be counted like our \$. But at this time the average wage was very often only DM 200 per month (not per week!).
- 2. Since then I was never without birds. Sometimes I had only 2 breeding birds (because of the circumstances, such as little room), sometimes more. Most of the time I had canaries, visited also shows in Germany with some good results, was involved in the local club in my home city etc. Later I became a kind of an expert for colour canaries. These birds were still very rare in Germany at this time. The main breed was the Roller Canary.
- 3. Since I have lived in NZ (1989) I had mainly canaries. But also Gouldian finches at some time, Plumheads and Bengalese. Also some Goldfinches. Because of bad health and my age I keep now only some canaries and 2 Pairs of Goldfinches. I might have to further reduce because of my health problems.
- 4. A birdhouse with 2 indoor aviaries and one outdoor aviary. But I might soon move to town because of my health problems and might not have enough space for many birds. But certainly, I will never be without birds, unless I am bed ridden or really very sick and weak.
- 5. This question is not easy to answer. I simply like birds.

- 6. Keep only those birds you really like and <u>not</u> because they are expensive and you might expect some income. Keep birds simply because you like them. And find out what kind of birds you like most. Follow your feelings. When you start, inform yourself about the needs of the birds you want to keep (Food, housing, breeding habits, are they social and can be kept together or do they need separate spaces or cages etc.).
- 7. At one of the shows in Auckland many years ago.
- 8. Carry on as usual. Make the shows as interesting as possible. Perhaps not only for insiders (competing and judging the birds), but also consider to have small aviaries with different birds. Many visitors want to see birds kept in more freedom and not only in small show cages. Perhaps an aviary with plants would provide a perfect show effect. Back in Germany we always had two or even more aviaries with different birds, decorated with branches from evergreen trees (pine, fur), the floor covered with rocks and mosses or made like the forest in case we had European birds. The housing always was decorated to the environment the birds would naturally live in. These aviaries were always a magnet for all sorts of visitors.

Well, that's all I have to say. Keep going and keep a good friendship, help each other, have an interesting show every year. Have somebody available to show visitors around, explain what kind of birds are in the cages, explain how they are kept, what they feed, and the like.... In other words: Have a member who is a kind of a PR-person.
